## Letter from Rev. Laura

Hanover College sits on the banks of the Ohio River. Founded in 1827 by Madison Presbytery, it is a vibrant place. From the end of WWII to 2005, our Synod held an event there each July called Synod School. My older son John and I could hardly wait until the time would come that we could go there because of all the stories we'd heard about it.

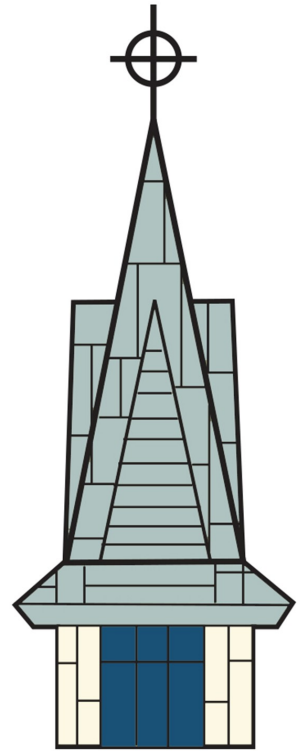
We lived in dorms and most of our days were focused on worship, classes, food, swimming, intramural events and lots of fellowshiping. It's kind of like going to 24 hour a day intergenerational Vacation Bible School and you become totally immersed in the community which stretches your heart and your brain. Some of my best friends are people that I see only at this or similar events. In time, I became chair of the Synod School Task Force. These days, I participate in a successor event called Covenant Gathering that shares the same values.

I love talking to our Doughboys because you never know what will come up. We've discovered that we used to spend hot July days elbow to elbow on the banks of the Ohio River at Synod School - Libby Rasmussen, the Pughs, the Bremners and my family. Jim (which one?) told me that he got in trouble his second year at Synod School because he brought a window AC unit with him, removed the screen from his room's window and set himself up for comfort! It's **hot** in July on the Ohio! The reason I laughed so hard is I'm grateful he did that BEFORE I was in charge of the event and would have had to be the one to make him remove the air conditioner and put the screen back in.

For me, one of the delights of being Presbyterian is this interconnectedness we have with each other. Because we value lifelong education for pastors and church folks, we have spent *per capita* dollars, for more than a century, on expanding people's minds and hearts and practices at events like Synod School. We believe we get the most value for our dollars spent by training leaders, who in turn go into the field and train others, maximizing our investment.

When we contribute to *per capita* giving we are supporting the operating of the levels of the church above us. The amount of **\$34.22** per UPC member supports the presbytery in its' work with congregations and pastors, supports the Synod in its training and education focus and supports the Office of the General Assembly in its ecumenical work, global commitments and partnerships and governing. When we choose to give this voluntary offering, we are not only helping UPC's budget, freeing money to be spent in other areas, we are also saying "I'm in, I belong and I want to support my church." Presbyterians never live in isolation. Personally, I like our interconnectedness, the support pastors freely give each other, the sense of community and being caught up in larger purposes with others. I like working in different parts of the Synod and finding everywhere I go people who I've been with without knowing it - at Synod School, at Triennium, at conferences - having their lives changed while mine was also being changed. I'm not sure what Jim learned about Jesus when he had to remove his air conditioner from his window, but I know that even today he is very glad he spent time with his family living as Christians are meant to live - in a rich, intentional, loving community where everyone is treated like the valuable equals they are in the eyes of God. It's made him a better person to have his life shaped by *per capita* dollars used to teach us how to be more like Jesus. That's why I give. How about you?

## Stewardship & Finance

### Stewardship and Finance Update on the 2019 budget

On April 7<sup>th</sup>, the following update was provided to the congregation about the 2019 budget.

- We have received 2 new pledges and 18 increases in 2019 giving, for a total of 31914.11. Thank you for your generosity.
- By April 12<sup>th</sup>, invitations to either pledge or increase pledges to the 2019 budget will have been sent to everyone.
- Properties is receiving bids to change to LED bulbs throughout the building and change the gym lights. This will result in both immediate and long term savings. The electric bill is 29,000.00/year. Please turn on lights only as needed and turn them off when not needed.
- The contract has been signed for the repair of the Dryvit exterior of the original building and the gift for this expense has been received. The work is scheduled for this summer and will take about three weeks, depending on the weather.
- The Session has established a Communications task force, headed by Charlotte Cronin.
- The Session is establishing a Fundraising committee, which will focus on raising money in a variety of smaller, ongoing ways and leadership is being recruited for this.
- The Session and Stewardship and Finance is not satisfied with past efforts for the annual pledge drive and for 2020 has set the following schedule:  
 April, May, June – all committees and boards – will establish budget needed for 2020  
 July and August – Stewardship and Finance will set and finalize 2020 budget  
 Sept, October, November – interpret needs to the congregation.

We are asking for pledges of time and talent; please let us know where you would like to serve:

- The new Preschool/Sunday School shared space has had about 35 volunteers helping with this transformation.
- The Christian Education Committee has just gone from 3 to 9 members!
- The Missions Committee has adopted a new structure.

Anyone in the congregation is welcome to initiate a REACH OUT card on a Sunday morning. Rev Laura, Aaron, or Keli will be happy to help you.

As a general rule, a maximum of 4 REACH OUT cards on any given Sunday is acceptable.

As church staff, we have initiated a REACH OUT card if someone is giving flowers in celebration of a birthday or anniversary. The two don't necessarily have to go together. For example, if you are giving flowers but do not want a REACH OUT card, please let us know.

The preschool committee is grateful for the confidence of our Synod in our mission which enables us to reach out locally.

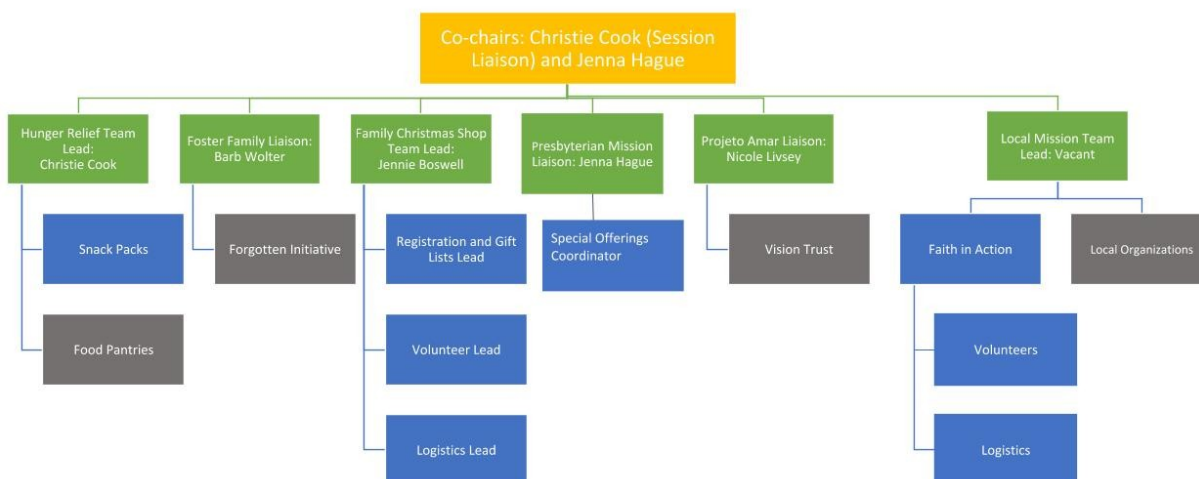

## Stroke Education

A stroke happens when a blood vessel in the brain bursts (hemorrhagic stroke) or the blood supply to part of the brain is blocked (ischemic stroke). In either situation, parts of the brain are damaged or die.

Each year in the United States, approximately 610,000 people have a new stroke. A stroke can happen to anyone, including children.

Factors that can increase the risk of stroke include age, sex, and ethnicity. While these factors cannot be controlled, unhealthy habits can be changed. These include smoking, excess alcohol intake, and lack of exercise. High blood pressure, diabetes, and high cholesterol are also risk factors for stroke.

The most common symptoms of a stroke are a sudden severe headache without a known cause, sudden confusion or difficulty speaking or understanding what others are saying, difficulty seeing; sudden dizziness or difficulty with walking, coordination, and balance; and sudden weakness or numbness in the leg, arm, or face.

It is very important to call 9-1-1 immediately if someone is having any of these symptoms. Treatments that work best are only available if the stroke is diagnosed within 3 hours of the initial symptoms. If you think someone is having a stroke, do this simple test.

**F – Face:** Have the person smile. Do you see a droop on one side of the face?

**A – Arms:** Have the person lift both arms. Does one arm drift downward?

**S – Speech:** Have the person repeat a simple phrase. Is their speech strange or slurred?

**T – Time:** If any of these signs are present, call 9-1-1 immediately.



Treatment for a stroke depends on the type of stroke that has occurred. An ischemic stroke can be treated with a “clot-busting” drug if the person is able to get to the hospital within 3 hours of the first symptoms. Hemorrhagic strokes may be treated with endovascular procedures or surgery.

Rehabilitation may be necessary after a stroke. Several types of therapies are available including speech, physical, and occupational depending on a person’s specific needs. If depression develops after a stroke, therapy and medication may help. Joining a patient support group may also be helpful.

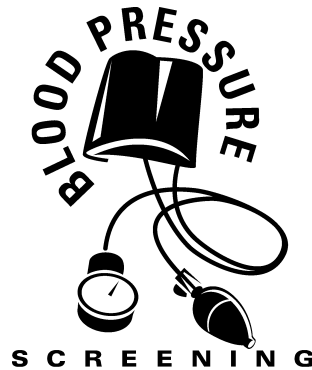

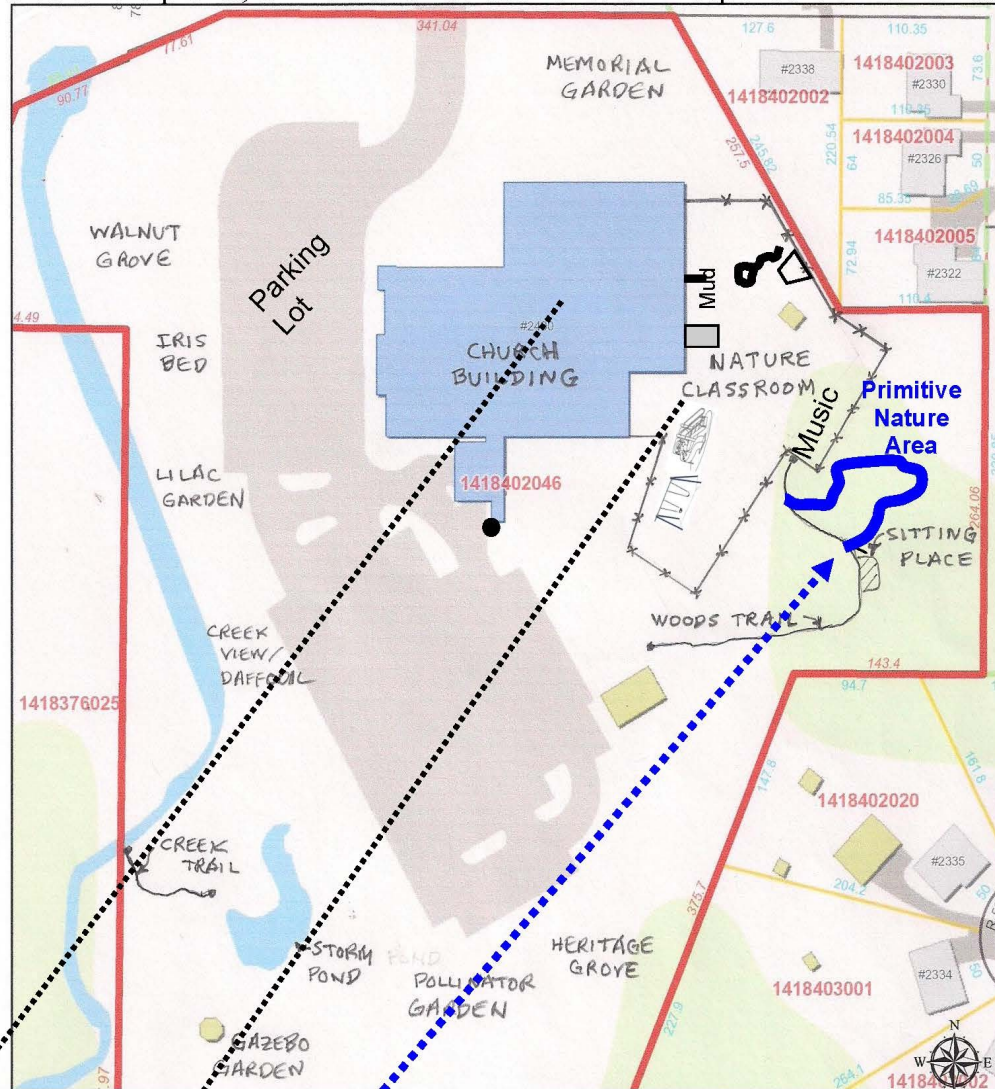

# Nature Connections

## Primitive Nature Area

Announcing our new way for UPC children and families to experience nature in a **natural** condition, an area where plants, animals and habitats function independent of human activity.



Vicarious Experiences	Indirect Experiences	Direct Contact Experiences
Learning about nature Books, videos, Viewing such as zoos	Going to prepared spaces Interaction in groomed and controlled areas	Playing: unstructured, imaginative, exploratory play Children manipulate, arrange, and plan experiences

**Primitive Nature Area:** This area is for children to have *direct contact with nature* in its natural state with no alteration or development of the area beyond safety considerations. A primitive nature area provides opportunity for children to have unstructured play and exploration of natural elements of the woods. Children observe changes in flora and fauna throughout the seasons and interact with self-sustaining features and processes of a natural environment. UPC Discovery's Primitive Nature area can be used by classrooms of children under direct supervision of teachers and by families. A mulched winding path off of the Woods Trail provides access to the area and adds a sense of adventure. Another way for children and adults to connect with God's Natural World!
